Dr. Kareem El Domanhoury (Media, Film, Journalism) is an academic and multimedia journalist. With over 12 years of media experience, he is currently a content producer at CNN International. Much of his research has centered on the use of new media and visual communication strategies by nation states and violent militant groups as well as on the emergence of alternative proto-state media systems.

Dr. Kamilah Legette (Psychology) researches individual and institutional racial biases in teachers and schools and their impact on youth academic performance and social-emotional and identity development as well as the implications of biases on teachers' curricular placement and discipline decisions.



Dr. Lisa Martinez (Sociology) researches the nuances and contours of Latinos' lives. She has published work on Latino political participation, the 2006 immigrant rights mobilizations, and mobility pathways of undocumented youth.

Dr. Kristy Ulibarri (English) specializes in Latinx literature and culture, 20th and 21st century multiethnic literature of the U.S., speculative fiction, cultural studies, and theory. Her current focus is on Latinx literature, film, and photography about immigration, labor, and free-market political economy.
